Overview

2006 was the last time the Inner Harbor was dredged

Without dredging activities, portions of the Inner Harbor began to experience silting which, if left unaddressed, could adversely affect the Working Waterfront





Overview

In 2018, the County and the City engaged Coastal Carolina University (CCU) to complete a feasibility study to identify potential engineering solutions to address the recurring silting issues in the Inner Harbor.





Overview

During the course of the study, CCU met with the County, the City and the Working Waterfront Coalition to understand the issues and discuss potential engineering solutions.





Overview

In December 2019, CCU issued its report.

The report identified potential solutions and recommended engaging an engineering firm to further evaluate solutions.





Overview

In January 2021, after a competitive selection process, the County engaged GEL Engineering to:

- 1) Further investigate and model potential solutions; and,
- 2) Make recommendations on next steps.
